Fifth Sunday of Lent Pastor's Corner

Dear Sisters and Brothers.

The Lord give you peace.

For those preparing for baptism, or preparing for ordination or marriage, or religious profession of vows, doubts can tug at us as we near the date in question. Are we really making the right choice? Is this really the path that God wants me to follow? What am I getting myself into? The last few days can be particularly difficult if some of our family members and friends are sharing their doubts or suggesting that we choose a different path. Bachelor or bachelorette parties before a wedding, aimed at showing the engaged what she/he might miss by becoming married, are one example of how others can cause us to doubt the path on which we about to embark. Such actions might keep us bound by doubt, rather than freeing us to enter fully and joyfully into the experience of the sacrament or liturgical rite.

It is perhaps for this reason that today, two weeks before the Easter Vigil, the Church has traditionally proclaimed the gospel story of the raising of Lazarus. In this narrative, Jesus states unequivocally that he is the Resurrection and the Life. He demonstrates that he came to give us life when he orders Lazarus to come out of the grave. The community assists Lazarus when Jesus orders them to untie him.

Elsewhere in this weekend's gospel we encounter the smallest and perhaps the most powerful verse in Sacred Scripture: "Jesus wept" (John 11:35). Jesus understands the pain and the anguish that can come with an experience of loss or doubt. He knows that, at times, the community of family and friends can continue to inflict pain by instilling a sense of doubt or by not releasing a person from their past. For this reason, Jesus orders them to "Untie him and let him go." Heeding this command may we speak words of encouragement to our sisters and brothers that instill confidence and not doubt.
