Fourth Sunday of Lent Pastor's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Lord give you peace.

I recently reminded the seminarians that Lent is a season for discernment. Looking back at Ash Wednesday, I recalled that the Lord exhorted us to be people of prayer, discipline and greater generosity. How are we doing now that we are four weeks into Lent? Are we faithful in lifting up our minds and hearts to our everpresent God? Are we persevering in our "fasting" from food, from our selfish use of time, from our tendency to self-indulgence? And as for the call to give, are we not only just but sacrificial in sharing our limited resources with others? Church, we are invited to discern whether our Lenten practices are from God or from some other source.

St. Paul, a master in the art of discernment, offers indications as to the presence of God's spirit (Gal 5:22). Three signs stand out: love, joy, and peace. If our behavior, values, and relationships lead to an increase of these fruits of the Holy Spirit, we have some assurance that we are on the right track. By contrast, if chaos, sadness, and indifference characterize our lifestyle, serious questions have to be raised.

After serving in formation work for close to twenty-five years, I can say that it is not unusual for people to be divided in the attempt to figure out what is of God and what is not. The Pharisees were divided because some of them gave great weight to the laws surrounding the Sabbath while others focused on the consequences of the deeds done on that holy day. Jesus kept the Sabbath by doing the Father's will: bringing life to others through the gifts of love and mercy. We are invited to do the same. May God bless your efforts!
