Family Perspectives

God wants to bless our families. Are we too busy and stressed to notice and accept these blessings? God is present, waiting to meet and bless us in our families, but needs our time and attention. We need to take time together as families to have fun, to talk, to work together, to eat and pray. Schedule some "family times" in the calendar and see Jesus in the transfiguration of your family members and relationships.

Reflection

Ben Franklin reportedly joked from time to time about waking up earlier to economize on candle usage. Daylight Saving Time starts on the Second Sunday of Lent this year. First used in 1908 in Thunder Bay, Canada, its purpose is to save energy and make better use of daylight. All of us, it seems, busy about many things, look for ways to save time, economize on energy, and find more light.

Jesus was transfigured before his disciples. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became white as light. A heavenly voice did not tell the disciples to look at him but instead, "Listen to him."

Listen, learn, and, in the light of the Transfigured One, face our fears, problems, difficulties, and seemingly unbearable life issues. If we listen well, we won't "lose" an hour worrying and running to catch up on some "things." Instead, we can "gain" an hour through attention to abstinence, almsgiving, and practice of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy—not only during the Holy Season of Lent but all the time.

Lenten Regulations

Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence (from meat) for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. Bishop Thomas has dispensed the faithful from the obligation to abstain from meat on the Memorial of St. Patrick observed this year on Fri., March 17th. Those who choose to partake of meat on that day are encouraged to undertake another penance that day in the form of a corporal or spiritual work of mercy.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Mission of Mercy Ministry

Pope Frances named 2016 "The Year of Mercy." Holy Spirit Women's Guild started a "Mission of Mercy Ministry" in June of 2016, as a pilot program, visiting our parishioners confined in nursing homes or assisted living facilities. They visit 3-4 nursing homes from east side to west side. A Eucharistic minister is always assigned to give communion to those able to receive communion. We pray, sing and fellowship. A bulletin and other church literature are left. We were able to visit four of our parishioners before they were called home to glory. Every one of us that served in this ministry feel blessed from our experience.
