ARE YOU COLD IN CHURCH?

... me too. We've been having trouble with the compressor that pumps the heat from the boiler to the church itself. While it's cold in church, the temperature in Mulligan Hall makes people want to put on shorts and apply sunscreen — the compressor is not moving the heat upstairs. As I write these words on Wednesday morning, Stack Heating is here for the sixth time in about fourteen days trying to diagnose the problem and repair what's wrong. I don't know if we've got it right yet, but I appreciate your patience even as I am losing mine.

Similarly, it's time for an update on the request for a little extra help with winter expenses at the parish. In particular, we're talking about our bill for natural gas and our expenses related to snow plowing and salting our driveways, parking lots, and sidewalks. Hold your breath, it's shocking.

In November, December and January, our invoices for natural gas have totaled \$13,041.96. And our invoices for snow removal have totaled \$14,690.00.

To date, your extra generosity has given the parish an additional \$2,650.00 in donations designated for our winter expenses. Thank you for your generosity. Every little bit helps.
