**VIOLENCE IN OUR NEIGHBORHOODS
HOW DO WE RESPOND?**

A nine-year old girl dies in the cross-fire in the Lee-Harvard neighborhood. In the same neighborhood a man steals a car from a gas station while a young child is strapped-in in the back seat. A police officer is shot dead in Mentor. A man accosts a woman out for an early morning jog in Garfield Park. As I'm writing these words, I'm hearing of a shooting at a newspaper bureau in Annapolis, Maryland. And then there's the plethora of violent acts we call to mind simply by the name of the city: Parkland, Florida; Orlando; Charleston; Columbine; and who knows how many more.

My question, however, is more local. How should, how can, our parish respond to the violence of our neighborhoods? I know that the causes and the sources of these kinds of events are extremely complicated and will never be fully known. Human behavior is much more complicated than that.

I am asking you today to think about this with me. Perhaps we can respond in several ways. I'm thinking out loud as I write these words hoping that it might be the beginning of generating some fruitful ideas.

Maybe we can dedicate a town hall meeting to such a discussion; in any way you choose, please let me know what you think.
