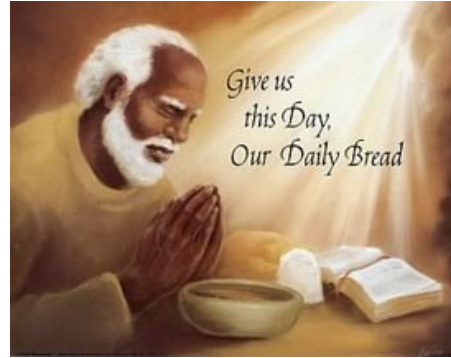
**ON BOILERS AND HEAT IN THE CHURCH

At the same time they will replace one of the boilers in the school building.

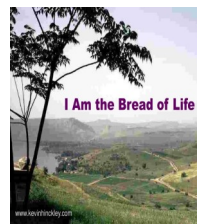
By the end of September our entire parking lot will be sealed for the coming winter after a few spots have been repaired.

**PSR BEGINS IN TWO WEEKS
SEPTEMBER 8, 2018**

For the first time we are opening a pre-K class for three- and four-year-old youngsters. Other classes are for grades K-1, 2-3, 4-6, 7-8. Registration forms are at the church doors.

The same form is used for registering students for the First Communion and Confirmation classes. Candidates for first communion and confirmation are also expected to attend the appropriate grade level of our PSR program. The two classes work in tandem.

This year we are going to use a new curriculum from the Pflaum Publishing Group which seems very promising for several reasons: each lesson is based on that week's Sunday readings; the editors keep the curriculum and materials current; the materials are sensitive to cultural and racial diversity; and some of our neighboring parishes use the program and are quite satisfied. We're going to give it a try and see if it works for us.
