WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 3, 2018 The Passing of Saint Francis of Assisi

Mr. David Williams will direct the music that evening, and we are inviting as many choir members as are able to join him. All members of our parish are invited to come to the Saint Paul Shrine to celebrate with the Capuchin friars and the Poor Clare Sisters.

MORE CAPUCHIN NEWS

All the major leaders of the Capuchin Order from around the world were gathered in Rome these last three weeks to plan for the next six years. They elected new leaders for the international order, and they had the opportunity to meet with Pope Francis personally. Our provincial minister, Fr. Tom Betz, summarized Pope Francis' remarks in this way:

The Pope began by saying that Capuchins are always "of the people," with ordinary people and that they are loved because they are the friars of the people. He urged us, with some insistence, to never lose our closeness to the people. The Holy Father pressed us to be men of reconciliation first in society, families and in the church. But he noted our special reputation for offering the sacrament of reconciliation. He said that in Buenos Aires the people want to go to the Capuchins for confession because the Capuchins listen and don't ask a lot of questions.

He mentioned how he was moved during his recent visit to Ireland by his time with the Capuchins in Dublin who humbly feed the poor. He said that the Capuchins in Dublin are like the Capuchins in Argentina — they listen. Again, he said, they don't ask the people who come for help a lot of questions; they just listen, they don't judge. They help.

He then urged us to keep our simplicity, especially our simplicity in prayer. He ended by telling us to always be simple men who are close to the people and who lead them to pray in a simple way.

I repeat all that here just to let you know that this is what I and the eight other Capuchin friars in the Cleveland area strive to be. I hope we live up to what you have a right to expect from us.
