Dear parishioners:

This letter is about our parish's efforts to find a way to respond to local violence in collaboration with nearby Christian church communities. We first opened the conversation among ourselves in a town hall meeting last October. Since that time, a small group of people have been working to build upon that conversation. Those people, helping to move this project along with me, are fellow parishioners: Deacon Ron James, Patricia Douglas, Kathy Ewing, Jewel Jones, and Stacey Collier.

While our work has been progressing slowly, we believe we made a significant and energizing step forward. This past Saturday evening, we welcomed people from three local churches to our parish center. We shared a simple meal together and then spoke openly for about two hours. Neighbors came from Zion Chapel Baptist Church, Lee Heights Community Church (both on Lee Road), and Holy Trinity Baptist Church (East 131st Street).

We quickly found common ground and everyone spoke wholeheartedly and passionately from their experiences, their expertise, and their desire that our churches practice what we preach. Near the end of our time together we pushed ourselves to be practical and realistic in discussing the next step (and steps) we can take. At the end of this month, this same group of churches will meet again to plan a gathering of our four church communities so that we all broaden our acquaintance with each other. We want our congregations to get to know each other. And then we want to move on to develop and implement strategies designed to help us introduce ourselves to our neighbors.

These steps are closely aligned with those our parish articulated at our town hall meeting this past October. For now, I am asking you for your prayers to support these conversations and efforts. As Pastor Flanagan of Holy Trinity Baptist Church put it last Saturday, we're not about creating "a moment, but a movement." A solitary event might make a big, temporary splash, but a carefully and prayerfully discerned course may have more lasting impact.

Throughout our conversation, we were aware that our actions can bear fruit only if we rely on God's grace and respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. Please remain prayerful. And I'll keep you up to date as these efforts unfold.
