

Several weeks ago when Bishop Perez announced a uniform posture throughout the diocese, from the singing of the Lamb of God until the end of the Communion Hymn, Father David also encouraged those who cannot kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer to remain standing (if able), as a more reverent posture than sitting down. Many have chosen to do so. In fact almost the entire congregation at the 4:00 pm Saturday Mass remains standing.

This is simply a word of encouragement to those who choose to stand at whatever Mass you attend. Standing is a posture that expresses respect and reverence, and is therefore appropriate to our celebration of the Eucharist.
