

#### JUNETEENTH



This past Wednesday, June 19<sup>th</sup>, celebrated as *Juneteenth*, commemorates one of the final acts of emancipation of enslaved persons in the

United States. After nearly 250 years of slavery here, the announcement was made that tens of thousands of African Americans in Texas had been emancipated. The announcement came  $2\frac{1}{2}$  years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation of January 1, 1863, which officially ended slavery in the U.S. However, since that proclamation was made during the Civil War, the executive order was unknown to many, especially in the Confederate States, until Major General Gordon Granger delivered the news to Texas himself.

On 19 June 1865, General Granger announced: The people of Texas are informed that ... all slaves are free. This involves an absolute equality of rights and rights of property.

May our country's leaders, and each one of us individually, always speak and act, establish policy and laws, to guarantee that those words are forever true.
