#### THE CHILD SEX ABUSE CRISIS: OUR PARISH RESPONDS

SUNDAY, 22 SEPTEMBER 2019

The task force has been planning another parish-wide gathering to follow up on last month's fruitful discussion of the church's sexual abuse scandal. On Sunday, September  $22^{nd}$  after the 10:15 Mass, Katelyn White, a speaker from a local advocacy group will meet with parishioners in Mulligan Hall to address the topic, *Sexual Violence 101*, with the goal of educating us on this issue in our church and in our society at large.

We can explore such questions as:

- How do we define sexual assault?
- Why do victims frequently wait for years to disclose their experience?
- What are the rights of the accused person?
- How does the statute of limitations restrict prosecution?
- How should we respond if a friend or family member tells us about a troubling sexual experience?

### MUSEUM OF AFRICAN AMERICAN CULTURE AND HISTORY PARISH PILGRIMAGE

**AUGUST 2019** 

Over the next several weeks, some of the people who were on our pilgrimage will offer some reflections on their experience in this space. Please watch this column for the takeaways from our brothers and sisters. I begin with these thoughts:

I think I might have asked our fellow parishioners to do an impossible task. I have no idea how to distill my visit to the African American Museum into one brief takeaway in 200 words or less. The moment that brought unexpected tears to my eyes was reading an account of a young mother, on the auction block, pleading that her child not be taken from her arms. Her pleading went unheeded. I don't know her name or the name of her child; but I've been asking her to pray for me and our community.

On the second day of our visit I was overwhelmed by the pain, the ugliness, the hatred, and the evil of the twentieth century's white supremacy movement. Particularly after visiting the rooms dedicated to the memory of Emmett Till's death and the courage of his mother, Mamie Till-Mobley, I wanted to leave the museum, but I forced myself to stay for another hour only because I knew I could walk away from the sight of so much evil whenever I chose, but so many people could not then, and cannot now.

Where does one find hope? It is in our community's reliance on faith and family. Rooted in the bonds of family and faith, we are strong and invincible in Jesus' arms. Where else did Mamie Till find the fortitude to do what she did? I scribbled onto a scrap of paper one of the quotations I read somewhere along the way in the museum — something about "the capacity of the human heart under such conditions." The women who have gone before us are as strong as they are loving and I am certain that from their place in Jesus' arms and through their prayers, the love and fortitude of Jesus himself sustains us in every challenge we face or will ever have to. For centuries they have held "family together" and sustained faith by "doing church" clandestinely late into the night, long after plantation owners retreated to their comfortable beds.

Finally, I have to tell you about the one thing that made me laugh out loud. I was watching a short video showing the crowd gathering on the Washington Mall the morning of August 28, 1963 gathering for what would become one of Martin Luther King, Jr's. most famous speeches. The video focused on the crowd and a young lady was talking to her male companion, describing her hope for that day and the future. Her comment to the young man beside her was, "How could anyone deny themselves of the pleasure of my company?"

May God bless us and keep us all as we honor and respect every human life, savoring the pleasure of each other's company.
