SHOULD WE STAND, SIT, OR KNEEL?

Almost six months ago, Bishop Pérez announced a renewal of the policy whereby all the parishes in the diocese adopt a uniform practice when it comes to our posture during the Communion Rite at Mass. It seems an opportune time to remind us of that policy.

The policy is that we all should remain standing after the Lamb of God, throughout the distribution and reception of Holy Communion and the singing of the Communion Hymn. Once the last person has received Holy Communion and the hymn ends, we may kneel or sit for private prayer.

As we all know, the bishops of the United States have established kneeling as the proper posture in our country during the Eucharistic Prayer. However, if you are not able to kneel, I encourage you to consider standing throughout the Eucharistic Prayer. Standing is a very respectful and reverent posture — just like we stand to greet people when they come into a room.

Without judging anyone else's choice, let's prayerfully consider our posture during the Eucharistic Prayer. Kneeling is the bishops' preference. I am suggesting that standing is a very good second choice for those who cannot kneel. If you need to sit, for any reason, then please do so without any hesitation or qualms.

**MUSEUM OF AFRICAN AMERICAN CULTURE AND HISTORY
PARISH PILGRIMAGE**

August 2019

Over the next several weeks, some of the people who were on our pilgrimage will offer some reflections on their experience in this space. Please watch this column for the takeaways from our brothers and sisters. Today, we offer reflections by Steve Abrams, a senior at Revere High School.



When I first heard of the trip to DC, I wasn't too excited because I wanted to stay home and relax for the remainder of my summer vacation. But I decided it would be better for me to go and see what it was all about. When I visited DC with my 8th grade class, in May of 2016, the museum was still under construction so I did not have an opportunity to visit there. So this trip was my opportunity to visit the National Museum of African American History and Culture.

When I arrived, I was intrigued by the unique architectural structure of the museum. As I walked in and headed down to the bottom floor exhibits, I was immediately overwhelmed with information and emotion. The sheer trials and tribulations that my African ancestors experienced, was enough to engulf me with anger and confusion.

As we went through the timeline of the exhibit, from the lower concourses up to the upper floors, the information became more positive. The first day we only made it through the lower level which contained much of the harsher parts of our history from freedom to slavery to civil rights. When we came back the next day, we visited the upper levels which took us through modern history of African Americans. The second level contained a Family History Center, and a lot of hands-on displays of history, like the Green Book car and the Media Arts Center.

The third floor contained African Americans in the military and sports. My favorite part was the wall to wall screen showing the greatest African American feats in sports history. The fourth floor was called the Cultural Galleries: music and arts. My favorite part on that floor was the interactive studio beat and rhythm screen. There you are able to align melodies of popular songs and add beats to them to create your own version of the songs.



My entire take on the museum was that of surprise. I was impressed at how influential our African American culture is to our society. The museum shows the world a very unknown part of our history and its influence on the world. I am happy that I changed my mind and was able to experience it all. I highly

recommend that everyone goes to visit the museum because it will bring to light a lot of information that is not generally known.

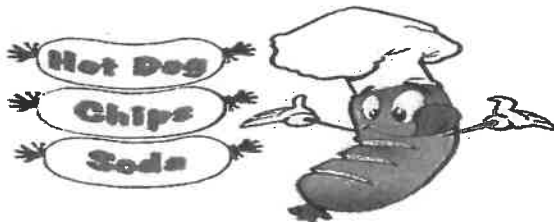
