Reflections on the Celebration of Sunday Mass

The Gospel Acclamation


The Liturgy of the Word begins as we sit to listen to the Scripture selections that are given us for the day. The first reading is almost always from the Old Testament. The psalmist leads us in a sung response to that text. The second reading is always from somewhere in the New Testament that is not one of the four gospels.

And then we all stand.

We stand to listen to the gospel of Jesus Christ — our most precious, cherished, and holy writings as Christians. That's why we stand; and we stand at attention, almost in a military precision way. Because the words of the gospel are the most dear to us, the most instructive to us, the most comforting, challenging, significant words we ever use — in church or anywhere else.

Almost all of the time when we stand for the reading of the gospel it is framed by a sung acclamation (an *Alleluia* before and after the proclamation). But in our parish we have a custom of not singing anything at those moments during the season of Lent.

Lent is designed to be a little more somber, a little more subtle. So when it happens that the deacon makes his way to the ambo in silence, think of the penitential nature of the season we have just entered. And hear the silence.

ON MASS TIMES

As many know, the timing of our two Masses on Sunday morning was discussed at the first parish pastoral council meeting. And we have solicited opinions from our parishioners, especially through the use of our suggestion boxes at the church doors.

Very few have offered a comment. And no one has disagreed with the suggestion that we give more time between the two Masses.

For those who have to be here for both Masses, the intervening time between Masses is short; and that is a significant reason why we are not able to start the 10:15 Mass on time.

Because (so far) no one is suggesting that we should not change our Mass times, a decision may be coming sooner rather than later.

The proposal is to change the first Sunday morning Mass to begin at 8:15; and then the second Mass will begin at 10:30. However, that doesn't mean that we who are the later Mass crowd get to wait another 15 minutes before we make our way to church.

Please come as you do; the greetings and conversations we have with each other are precious and dear. They are not to be denied. But if we publicize that our Mass is at a certain time, we should do our best to honor that. Almost all of the comments related to this issue make that point: if Mass is scheduled to begin at a certain time, then let's start. No one will quibble over five or seven minutes. But when we are going on twenty minutes, we are not being fair to each other and each one's schedule for the rest of the day. One more request: if you have an opinion, please offer it. Call the office or use of the suggestion boxes at the doors. A definite decision and change may be coming soon.
