My heart overflows with noble words. To the king I must speak the song I have made; My tongue as nimble as the pen of a scribe.

I don't know exactly why. But these words have been ringing in my ears since last Sunday. They are from Psalm 45 and are a part of the church's evening prayer on Monday evenings every fourth week.

I wish that I had made a plan last Sunday to count how many of us came down the driveway to pick up palm, to drop off regular offerings, to say "hi." We must have seen at least 200 vehicles. We started the day with 100 bulletins, and throughout the day I printed another 150. There are only 20-some remaining. If we gave away more than 200 bulletins, that many of us made the effort to connect to church in that way last Sunday.

And it was such a joy ... a simple joy of seeing each other, greeting each other, even if it was through the side window of a car. Thank you for coming. Even if you couldn't come, know that you are remembered and being prayed for. Thank you for loving your parish community and doing what it takes to stay connected to the Lord and to each other as a community. Like so many of us, I am so looking forward to the day I can stand at my chair in church and say, "welcome home."

TRUST IN GOD

But St. Paul reminds us in his Letter to the Phillippians to "have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your request be made known to God" (4:6). Then, he assures us, "the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (v.7). With steadfast prayer and thanksgiving, then, we do our best to put our trust in the Lord.

Let our actions reflect the trust and peace that can only be found in him. Stay close to Jesus and the Blessed Mother in prayer, asking that those who are suffering from the disease or from any related anxiety may find healing and peace.

How To Vote During Ohio's Postponement Of The Primary Election

For those who did not early vote prior to March 17th, there will not be any in-person voting whatsoever. You must now submit an absentee ballot.

Ohioans can vote by mail until April 27th; votes will be counted on April 28th, but ballot request forms must be received by the board of elections *before noon* on April 25th. Because elections board staff is reduced, the earlier you send in the request, the better.

The board of elections will send all registered voters instructions on how to apply for an absentee ballot. Instructions will also include how to complete and return the ballot, which can be mailed or hand -delivered to the elections office.

If you do not receive instructions to vote absentee, call your county's board of elections and request that a ballot be sent to you in the mail.

Voters must fill out the form, print it and mail it to their county board of elections. To find the mailing address for your county's board of elections, go to: https://www.ohiosos.gov/ elections/elections-officials/county-boards-of-electionsdirectory/.

All completed ballots must be mailed by April 27th. You need to request that the post office apply a postmark to the envelope.
