

STAYING CONNECTED

The Catholic Bishops of Ohio are supporting the governor's April 27th plan to begin phasing in a planned reopening of the state. The plan calls for a gradual return to work and daily activities. Their letter to all of us is posted on our parish website. This decision comes out of deep concern for the common good as well as the physical and spiritual well-being of all the people of Ohio.

The bishops have extended the temporary suspension of all publicly celebrated Masses, liturgies and other public services until May 29th, with the hope of publicly celebrating together the solemnity of Pentecost on the weekend of May 30-31st.

As our church remains closed to public services, the highest priority is that we stay connected as a community. Among several initiatives to help us stay connected, Father David has recorded a video message that you can view by accessing our website. He may be creating these messages periodically. Keep an eye on our website, not just for these messages, but for the recordings of our Sunday Mass and other important announcements.




CELEBRATING MOTHER'S DAY
