REOPENING OF THE CHURCH

At the church, we are gearing up to have our first public Mass since March. The church has been professionally sanitized and we will wipe down all pews, door knobs, bathroom fixtures, and so on after each Mass.

We are allowed to celebrate Mass together next week-end under certain guidelines. The guidelines are quite extensive. In order to guarantee that we can comply with safe practices, we will begin with only one Mass at least for the first few weekends.

Mass will be at 10:30 am.

The ushers will be on hand to answer questions and to help us comply with the safe practices we are asked to employ. Please cooperate with their directions.

As we get more proficient at sanitizing the church between Masses, and as the number of people coming to church increases, we will return the other two Masses to our regular weekend schedule. Please see the related article on the next page, "Change in Mass Times."

This weekend, a letter was sent to each active household in our parish summarizing the guidelines which most directly impact Sunday Mass participants. If you have not already received this letter, you will receive it within the next few days.

During Mass, everyone is to wear a face mask except for briefly pulling it down below your chin to receive Communion. Those who have particular ministerial roles in the liturgy may also remove their masks as their role suggests.

You will also notice that, at the direction of the diocese, all the hymnals, missals and loose paper have been removed from the church. The hymnals will return when permission is given.


**OPEN ONLY FOR MASS
