has changed us for the better.

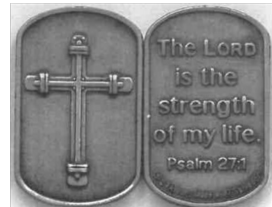
Give new and future fathers the guidance they need

JUNETEENTH

155 years after the news of emancipation reached enslaved peoples throughout the United States, the nation is still struggling with issues of systemic racism and injustice. Forty-seven states and the District of Columbia mark June 19th as a state holiday or observance. Despite a push by activists over the years, Juneteenth still isn't a federal holiday. It is a day that is often overlooked by non-black Americans.

Several members of Congress are sponsoring a renewed effort to have June 19th declared a federal holiday. If you care to lend your voice to that effort, our ushers have the contact information you will need to let our U.S. representatives know.
