MARCH ON WASHINGTON 28 AUGUST 2020



The date is the 57th anniversary of the original march and Dr. King's challenge to make the dream real. In light of our AUGUST 28. 2020 current civil circumstances, some wondered if the parish might charter a bus so as to attend. However, that seems

unwise in light of the pandemic. Even so, no one is discouraged from attending on their own initiative. When the application for a permit to demonstrate was submitted to the National Park Service, 100,000 people and 1000 buses were expected. A procession from the Lincoln Memorial to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial is planned. The park service accepted the permit application which means that demonstrations will take place, but so far no permit has been issued.

IMPORTANCE OF VOTING

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) states, "... we continue our call to Catholics across the U.S. to faithful reflection and discernment as we approach the elections." The USCCB also reminds us that in "the Catholic tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation."

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we do not know if we will be able to vote in person in the general election in November. So it is extremely important that 1) if you are not registered to vote, you do so as soon as possible, and 2) you submit an application to request an absentee ballot. To register to vote, go to https://olvr.ohiosos.gov/. To complete an application to request an absentee ballot, go to https://www.ohiosos.gov/ elections/voters/absentee-voting/.

It is important you complete these actions as early as possible, as analysts are predicting record submissions this year.
