PPE AND MASKS

This week we received lovely and heartfelt expressions of gratitude from the Street and Block Club presidents active in the Lee-Harvard neighborhood. Charlotte Brown of our parish is one of those presidents.

You may recall that we were asked to provide masks for residents of this area because it is particularly hard-hit by the coronavirus and it is still in great need of masks and other personal protective equipment (PPE).

One expression of gratitude noted that the rule of thumb is that one infected person infects three more; so, the prevention of one infection likewise prevents three. By that standard, the 465 masks we donated may be saving nearly 1400 lives.

But it's not just us. For instance, the managers and staff at Dave's Market went out of their way at the last minute to be supportive and helpful. And we don't know who else worked hard and anonymously to make the day so fruitful.

That's the way it is as a follower of the Lord: we don't usually get to know how God touches another person when he works through us. But today, we have the privilege of catching a glimpse of God's power working in our community. Let's savor that and allow it to encourage us to do the right thing every time, whether or not we get to see the fruit of our efforts.

IN THE HEAT OF THE SUMMER



While we are in the hottest and most humid days of the summer season, we must open all the windows and turn on the ceiling and floor fans in church. Often enough we open the outside doors. All of this creates a significant amount of background noise. Overcoming that is not easy and demands some special effort from everyone who uses a micro-

phone.

If you have difficulty hearing in church during these summer months, please know that there is nothing wrong with our sound system. As we are asking those who use a microphone in their service to our community for Sunday Mass to adjust their technique, we also must ask your patience and understanding.

It's the background noise, not the sound system.

NOT READY TO RETURN TO SUNDAY MASS?

Think about coming to Mass on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm. Since our reopening there are usually about 15 people in attendance, providing plenty of space to maintain physical distancing.

Part of the church's official midday prayer on Wednesdays goes like this:

> God of mercy, this midday moment of rest is your welcome gift. bless the work we have begun, make good its defects and let us finish it in a way that pleases you.

For many who come, our Wednesday evening Mass is such a welcome moment of rest in the midst of all the duties and responsibilities of ordinary life. It may be the kind of moment of rest that gives you the little lift you need to continue doing your work according to God's will. Consider it a small gift from our Lord to you. His yoke is easy, and his burden light.
