Reflections on the Celebration of Sunday Mass

In the middle of February this year, Father David began a series of articles under this title. Six articles appeared in the bulletin before the pandemic forced us to suspend the celebration of Sunday Mass. The first six articles, are being printed again; and then the series will continue from there. The following article is the second in the series and first appeared in the bulletin on February 23rd.

The Ambo

As the Liturgy of the Word begins our attention turns to the ambo. Sometimes it is also referred to as the pulpit. The ambo is one of three prominent focal points during the Mass (along with the altar and the presider's chair). It is the place from where the Word of God is proclaimed and preached. The only other thing that happens there are the invocations to pray after we recite the Creed.

Because it is considered a sacred space, where something holy is unfolding, we do not make general announcements from there. You will notice that neither the deacons nor anyone else any longer makes general announcements from the ambo. It is reserved for God's Word and our community's supplications.

The books that we use there are also considered sacred because they are the Word of God. Our movements around the ambo are deliberate. Have you ever noticed that the psalmist will not make a move toward the ambo until the reader has returned to his/her place ... and that the movements to and from the ambo are accentuated by a walk to the very center of the main aisle and a reverent bow to the altar? It's part of the reverence owed to the proclaiming of the Word of God and the place reserved for that purpose.
