Reflections on the Celebration of Sunday Mass

In the middle of February this year, Father David began a series of articles under this title. Six articles appeared in the bulletin before the pandemic forced us to suspend the celebration of Sunday Mass. The first six articles are being printed again, and then the series will continue from there. The following article is the third in the series and first appeared in the bulletin on March 1st.

The Gospel Acclamation

The Liturgy of the Word begins as we sit to listen to the Scripture selections that are given us for the day. The first reading is almost always from the Old Testament. The psalmist leads us in a sung response to that text. The second reading is always from somewhere in the New Testament that is not one of the four gospels.

And then we all stand.

We stand to listen to the gospel of Jesus Christ — our most precious, cherished, and holy writings as Christians. That's why we stand; and we stand at attention, almost in a military precision way. The words of the gospel are the most dear to us, the most instructive to us, the most comforting, challenging, significant words we ever use — in church or anywhere else.

Almost all of the time when we stand for the reading of the gospel it is framed by a sung acclamation (an *Alleluia* before and after the proclamation). But in our parish we have a custom of not singing anything at those moments during the season of Lent. There are many parts of the Mass that should always be sung; but if circumstances demand it, they may be recited. The stipulation, however, regarding the gospel acclamation is absolute: if it is not sung, it is omitted.

That is the way of all the acclamations that are part of our Sunday Mass. They are designed to be sung by everyone, and sung joyfully; please join all your brothers and sisters as we shout out praise to our God.

MORE WATER DAMAGE IN CHURCH

If you've stepped inside the small chapel near the northeast corner of the church, you may have noticed that there is more water damage in the ceiling paint and plaster. That entire section of roof, small and flat, was replaced in the fall of 2018. The Paul Davis Company, who did the first repair, is confident that the current damage to the interior is due to residual moisture that remained in the building after the repair. They claim that the exterior roof remains intact and protects the building from the elements.

Our insurance company is adding this new problem to our initial claim against damages. The repair is not going to cost us anything; we paid our deductible more than eighteen months ago.

In the next several weeks you may see some scaffolding and other paraphernalia related to ceiling repairs in the chapel. Don't be alarmed; our church building is solid and being looked after.

2021 MISSALS

It's the time of year when we place our order for next year's missal. We are not ordering missals for the pews because we do not know if we will be allowed to use them. But we have ordered about 50 copies that will be available for sale this fall for personal use. We'll let you know when they arrive.

AWAY ON RETREAT

Father David is making his annual retreat beginning on Sunday, August 30th. After that day's responsibilities are complete, Father David will be on retreat until Saturday, September 12th. Brother Mick will celebrate the Sunday Mass on the 6th, and Fr. John Paul Kuzma (a friar new to Cleveland at Borromeo Seminary) will celebrate the Wednesday evening Masses those two weeks.

Throughout the time, Father David will stay in contact with the church office and respond as needed. While he is praying for you, please ask the Lord to bless his time away and hold him in his care.

ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATIONS

Government officials are urging voters to vote by mail, as early as possible. CENSUS 2020

You still have until September 30th to submit your Census 2020 data. The Census determines the amount of federal programs and funding that will be available in local communities for the next ten (10) years. It is ex-

ELECTRONIC SIGN

The new electronic sign has been ordered to replace the irreparable one. The cost, including removal of the old sign, installation of the new and its software is \$11,750.
