Reflections on the Celebration of Sunday Mass

In the middle of February this year, Father David began a series of articles under this title. Six articles appeared in the bulletin before the pandemic forced us to suspend the celebration of Sunday Mass. The first six articles are being printed again, and then the series will continue from there. The following article is the fifth in the series and first appeared in the bulletin on March 15^{tb} .

The Universal Prayer

The Universal Prayer has also been called the Prayers of the Faithful and the General Intercessions. It brings the Liturgy of the Word to a close.

We speak of the Priesthood of all the Faithful in the church; every one of us who is baptized is a priest in the sense that we all have a duty to offer prayers. Offering prayer is an essential obligation of the priesthood — an understanding that goes all the way back to the earliest days of the Old Testament.

The deacon announces what we are asked to pray for; that's not the prayer itself, but only the request that we pray. Not the words of the deacon, but rather our response to his bidding is our prayer. That's why it is so important that we all respond to the invocations — we are fulfilling our priestly function when we do.

Recently we have begun to sing our response; please join all of your brothers and sisters to sing our prayer at the direction of the cantor. We are doing a holy thing when we do.

CONFIRMATION LITURGY POSTPONED AGAIN

We have decided to wait a little longer before we celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. Originally scheduled for May 31st, and then rescheduled for September 20th, is postponed again due to the pandemic. Because this is the second time we have asked Abbot Gary Hoover, OSB to postpone his visit to our parish for confirmation, Father David has written to the diocese asking to be delegated himself to confer the sacrament when the timing is right for us. We have been in communication with the families.

FIRST COMMUNION

Our First Communion liturgy was postponed from May 10^{th} because we were not permitted to celebrate Mass in public then. First Communion will be celebrated with the seven youngsters of the class on Sunday, September 27^{th} at the 10:30 am Mass.

THE GOOD FRIDAY / HOLY LAND COLLECTION

Because we were not able to gather in church to celebrate Good Friday this year, we did not take this collection in person. However, parishioners responded generously nonetheless both online and by using the envelope that was in the packet for March and April.

You may hear that the bishops of the United States have rescheduled the collection for next Sunday. But because donations for the Holy Land from our parish are already on a par with our yearly average, we will not go through the motions of adding a second collection next weekend. If you missed the opportunity to give to the important work of the church in the Holy Land, you are always free to give. Simply mark your donation for the Holy Land and drop it in our collection basket on any Sunday, or use the appropriate link when giving online.

FR. AKOLLA HAS BEEN REASSIGNED



Fr. Akolla Etuge, O.F.M. Cap. has been reassigned to St. John the Evangelist Church in Philadelphia, effective October 1st. He will celebrate Mass here next Sunday to thank us for his time among us and the role we played

in leading him toward his ordination to the priesthood. It will also be our opportunity to thank Fr. Akolla for sharing his gifts and for his time among us. We will miss him and we promise to keep him in our prayers as he begins his new assignment.

ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATIONS

Registered voters should receive from the Secretary of State an application for an absentee ballot; it is to be mailed around Labor Day. However, due to possible mail delays, it is recommended that you don't wait, that you either: 1) download an application to receive your absentee ballot at <u>https://www.ohiosos.gov/elections/voters/ absentee-voting/</u> or, 2) pick up an application form at the church entrances. Once completed, mail it or drop it off in the secure box at your county Board of Elections office. Contact the church office if you have questions.
