

Reflections on the Celebration of Sunday Mass

In the middle of February this year, Father David began a series of articles under this title. Six articles appeared in the bulletin before the pandemic forced us to suspend the celebration of Sunday Mass. The first six articles are being printed again, and then the series will continue from there. The following article is the fourth in the series and first appeared in the bulletin on March 8th.

The Gospel, the Homily, and the Creed

The proclamation of the gospel is the apex of the Liturgy of the Word just as the eucharistic prayer is the climax of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Standing for the reading of the gospel shows our reverence for the four New Testament texts that we consider to be the most sacred and most consequential in all the Scriptures. They tell the story of Jesus, after all, and challenge us to learn his teaching and imitate his ways. Our attentiveness is our fullest participation.

The homily is ordinarily based on the Scripture texts of the day. It may also speak to other aspects of the liturgy. A good homily should feed and nourish us in the same way the Body and Blood of Christ nourishes us.

Following a brief period of silence, we stand to proclaim together what we believe as a church about our God and his activity in salvation history by reciting the Creed. This is another moment when our active participation is not only our right, but also our duty.

2021 MISSALS

CONFIRMATION LITURGY POSTPONED AGAIN

We have decided to wait a little longer before we celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. Originally scheduled for May 31st, and then rescheduled for September 20th, it is postponed again. Because this is the second time we have asked Abbot Gary Hoover, OSB to postpone his scheduled visit to our parish for confirmation, Father David has written to the diocese asking to be delegated himself to confer the sacrament when the timing is right for us.

FIRST COMMUNION

Our First Communion liturgy was postponed from May 10^{th} because we were not permitted to celebrate Mass in public then. We are in consultation with the families of the first communicants to possibly celebrate that sacrament on Sunday, September 27^{th} .
