KEEPING OUR COMMUNITY STRONG

The Sunday Mass is averaging 74 people in attendance. People participating through YouTube, either live or later through the recording, averages 159.

This suggests that the parish should put more efforts into expanding our ability to live stream certain events and activities. This will require more people willing to help; please see the related article on the next page of this bulletin.

Beginning on Wednesday, November 25th, we hope to begin streaming that weekday Mass each week. It's a second opportunity to participate in a live event at the parish from the safety of home. That Wednesday Mass will be our celebration of Thanksgiving Day.

Additionally, Father David is working on a plan to offer a regular series of presentations on Thursday evenings at 6:30 pm in church for those who wish to attend in person, and it will also be live-streamed. If we have enough people to help with the video, and enough people interested enough to participate regularly, these Thursday evening presentations will become a regular, on-going series. The presentations will be based on the Scriptures and liturgy. Live streaming allows us the opportunity to make the presentations a bit interactive in that YouTube viewers can submit a comment or question during the presentation. More information will be forthcoming.

When we first offered the possibility of online giving as another way for parishioners to make their contributions to the support of the parish, we had no idea that we were only half a

dozen weeks away from all in-person church activities being shut down because of a growing pandemic. The availability of this giving option spared our parish from the significant decline in contributions that other parishes experienced through the spring and summer.

The coronavirus is still among us and spreading. The current restrictions on church gatherings will be with us for some time yet. As the autumn is quickly turning to winter, we are anticipating the increased costs associated with the season, particularly: heating the church, snow plowing and salting the parking lot and sidewalks.

Online giving is a safe and convenient way you can continue to help us cover our expenses even when a pandemic or the weather deem it unsafe for you to come to church in person.

If you haven't tried electronic giving yet, maybe this winter is a good time to start. You can always discontinue any time you want. The first time you give electronically, there will be a little more information to input; but after you have an account set up, donating is easy and convenient. More importantly, it is secure and safe.
