

BLACK CATHOLIC HISTORY MONTH Let's call it Current Events Month

We Are Part of Building that History Today

On the last Sunday of Black Catholic History Month, it is most appropriate to acknowledge and celebrate those of us right here. We are building Black Catholic History every day.

Let's start with our deacons: Deacon Shelby Friend and Deacon Ronald James. Paving the way for Deacon Ron and Deacon Shelby was Joseph Newman, Cleveland's first permanent deacon and a nationwide leader of training for his counterparts. Deacon Joseph Newman, a former member of Saint Henry and Saint Timothy parishes became one of the first United States Catholic deacons in 1971. Black deacons comprise only 2% of the deacons in the United States.

Deacon Friend and Deacon James continue to be part of our Black Catholic history, as Deacon Friend has been serving for 26 years as a deacon at Saint Henry and Holy Spirit parishes. Even though he is recently retired, he'll never stop serving our community in many ways, particularly by visiting the homebound.

Deacon James has been a deacon for 11 years and is very active on our behalf. Do you know that he takes a strong lead in hosting a grieving family when we gather in church for a funeral? Do you know that he writes the texts that are used in the General Intercessions and the Penitential Act at every Mass? ... He writes the introductory comments we use every Sunday.

May Deacon Newman, Deacon Friend and Deacon James, as part of our Black Catholic history, inspire current and future generations to make their contribution to our story.

Look around church today. Do you see someone whom you think you should thank for being a part of Catholic history? Please take the time to go out of your way to do exactly that.

Let's celebrate all of us who are keeping a rich and vibrant history moving toward God's kingdom.

KEEPING OUR COMMUNITY STRONG

Not only on Sunday:

Our livestreaming of Sunday Mass has not yet missed a broadcast, and the expressions of appreciation for providing this service remain strong.

But also on Wednesday:

We have begun livestreaming the Wednesday Mass as of last week. It's a second opportunity to participate in a live event at the parish from the safety of home.

And now on Thursday:

This week we will begin a regular series of presentations on Thursday evenings at 6:30 pm in church for those who wish to attend in person, and it will also be livestreamed. The presentations will be based on the Scriptures and liturgy. Livestreaming allows us the chance to make the presentations a bit interactive in that YouTube viewers can submit a comment or question during the presentation. The first date is Thursday, December 3rd. They will continue on December 10th and 17th, before taking a Christmas break until after the arrival of the new year. The title of Father David's presentation is: *The Year of Grace*. He promises it will be more interesting than it sounds.

To make these extra livestreaming efforts sustainable, please be sure to express your appreciation to those who generously provide the service and are working hard to get better at it week by week. And encourage others to join the effort; we can always use more helpers.
