GAUDETE SUNDAY



Today is the Third Sunday of Advent - also known as *Gaudete* Sunday. The word "gaudete" is derived from the Latin words "gaudium," joy, and "gaudeo," to rejoice or be glad.

There is joy in looking forward to the annual celebration of Christmas, but there is also joy in looking back to remember the birth of Jesus on the first Christmas. The joy is heightened by the importance of his birth — that he was born to save his people from their sins. The joy also extends to anticipation of the Second Coming, either at the end of physical life or the end of the world, the time when believers will be given the crown of righteousness and a place in the Father's house to dwell with God.

Providing us with encouragement to continue our spiritual preparation is the reason that the third candle of the Advent wreath, which is lit today, is traditionally rose-colored. We shift our reflection from "the Lord is coming" to "the Lord is near." Rejoice as you light the rose candle on your Advent wreath.

TODAY'S PRAYER

Lord God, may we, your people, who look forward to the birthday of Christ experience the joy of salvation and celebrate that feast with love and thanksgiving.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
