

A COMPOSER AMONG US

The Mass setting which we have been using in church since the First Sunday of Advent was composed by our own David Williams. Written so that we can give great glory to God, he entitled it, *Mass of the Epiphany* in honor of our parish anniversary.

A Mass setting typically includes these pieces which are always sung: the Gloria, the Alleluia, the Holy, Memorial Acclamation, Amen, and Lamb of God.

When you have a chance, thank David for his excellent work, not just on this Mass setting, but also for all he does to support our worship of God.

BLESSING OF THE HOUSE



Traditionally on the Feast of the Epiphany, also known as the twelfth night, Theophany, and Three Kings Day, Christians have blessed their homes, using a practice sometimes known as "chalking the doors."

The following inscription is marked above the doorway of the door in chalk:

$$20 + C + M + B + 21$$

The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also represent the Latin words "Christus mansionem benedicat" which means "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs symbolize the cross and the 20 and the 21 represent the year, 2021.

As a family, as you enter into the new year, you can bless your house by getting some chalk and writing the inscription above your doorway. Taken together, this inscription is a request for Christ to bless our homes and that he stay with those who dwell there throughout the entire year. Seeing the symbols over our doors can help to remind us, while passing in and out on our daily routines, that our homes and all those who dwell there belong to Christ. As you write the inscription, say the prayer below:

May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever. Amen.
