Harriet Tubman was an escaped slave who became a leading figure in the abolitionist movement. She also served as a spy for the US army during the Civil War and was an active participant in the struggle for women's suffrage.

Their level of self-reflection and ability to grow spiritually and personally in difficult situations evince an impressive maturity for people so young. Here are a number of quotations from some of those essays:

- It doesn't matter how people see you. It matters how God sees you.
- I love the world, I feel like I'm personally connected with it.
- God guided me into the light and helped me become a better person.
- Many parents lost young children ... I pray that God is with them always.
- I brought myself down a lot. I kept trying and praying ... I knew God could do it, I just had to stay in faith.
