

TOWN HALL MEETINGS CONVERSATIONS FOLLOWING THE TRIAL FOR THE MURDER OF GEORGE FLOYD

On April 30th nine people were on the video conference call to discuss families' experiences of talking to their children about the verdict against Derek Chauvin. We invited Dr. Tyffani Dent, a local psychologist who works primarily with adolescents to provide her expertise in the conversation.

The conversation focused not only on the gross injustice done to George Floyd and its impact on young people, but quickly became much broader. Parents and grandparents described experiences and conversations with their children over the years. Experiences of success and frustration were shared. Everyone went away with new ideas and plenty more to continue reflecting upon.

After about 75 minutes the conversation came to a close with a commitment to try to spread the word about the next town hall meeting in this series. By the time you are reading this column on Sunday, the meeting will have taken place, but only after this bulletin has been printed.

The last of the three scheduled conversations was planned to be a discussion among school-age children and young people themselves. The plan was to give them the opportunity to share what is on their hearts these days in regard to race, racism, prejudice and privilege. A brief report on the conversation will be in next weekend's bulletin.

DRIVE-THROUGH EUCHARIST

We are continuing to offer the drive-through distribution of Communion today at 12:30 pm. Until you feel safe returning to church in person, this is a way you can receive Communion each Sunday. We will make the Eucharist available in this way until the bishop reinstates our obligation to attend Sunday Mass in person. Of course, in order to receive Communion, you should participate in the livestream feed of our Mass.

As Deacon Ron's retirement from his full-time duties became official at the beginning of this month, we made the effort to honor him in a special way.
