
We are called through the Holy Spirit to spread the Gospel message and reach out to the poor and oppressed. We are committed to know, understand, and love each other as members of Christ's body.

Attendance at the 10:30 Mass on Sunday has been on the rise. Is it because more people are vaccinated and are feeling safer about coming to church? Regular attendance may be growing beyond what is recommended in Ohio's pandemic guidelines for physical distancing.

TOWN HALL MEETINGS: CONVERSATIONS FOLLOWING THE TRIAL FOR THE MURDER OF GEORGE FLOYD

On May 7th, the third scheduled town hall meeting took place with approximately twelve people on the video conference call. The plan was to give young people a forum in which to share their feelings and experiences.

While only three young people were present, the conversation began with each of them briefly sharing and articulating what is going on in their minds and hearts these days regarding matters of race and racism.

From there, the adults engaged in an extensive conversation along the same lines. An important part of the conversation focused on concrete ways our parish community can take steps to effect change so that decades from now future parishioners are not still having the same conversation about the same injustices and frustrations. The overwhelming consensus of the group is that these dialogues must continue.

To that end, we are planning another town hall meeting. Our focus is not only going to be about the Derek Chauvin trial and conviction, or the brazen evil perpetrated against George Floyd and so many others; those events were the catalyst that sparked this initiative. The conversation has grown into something more broadly concerned with race, racism, privilege and prejudice.

We also want to make a deliberate attempt to invite men of our parish to participate in the dialogue. The men of our parish have experience and wisdom that has not yet been solicited. This is the official plea to the men to attend the next town hall and share with the parish your wisdom and insight:

HOLY SPIRIT CHURCH TO BE A VACCINATION SITE

In cooperation with former Garfield Heights councilwoman, Ms. Shayla Davis, the Ohio Department of Health, the sergeant major of the U.S. Army Reserves, and the governor's office, Holy Spirit Church will be a Covid-19 vaccination site. A mobile unit will be set up in our parking lot on the north end of the parish center for walk-up service. The Pfizer vaccine will be administered.

The first dose will be available on Friday and Saturday, June 4th and 5th. The second dose will be given three weeks later on June 25th and 26th. The goal is to give 150 shots on Friday and 200 on Saturday.

No appointment is necessary. If anyone is interested in helping, we can use some volunteers to help at registration tables and directing traffic. We will also be looking for help in spreading the word throughout Garfield Heights and beyond by asking business owners to display and distribute flyers. More information will be forthcoming.

The vaccination has been approved for everyone 12 years of age and older. This will be an excellent opportunity to have children vaccinated; but anyone looking to receive the shots is welcome.
