

# NINE NIGHTS OF NIGHT PRAYER

Holy Spirit Church has been asked by Bishop Malesic to be one of nine churches throughout the diocese to open our doors for nine nights in a row and lead the church in praying the church's official Night Prayer.

"Nine Nights of Night Prayer" will take place on nine consecutive evenings from Saturday, August 7<sup>th</sup> through Sunday, August 15<sup>th</sup>. Our doors will be open from 8:15 pm - 9:00 pm each night. The liturgy begins at 8:30.

The church's Night Prayer is deliberately short (lasting about twenty minutes): it's the end of the day; we're tired and looking forward to a peaceful night's rest. That is exactly what we pray for at Night Prayer: a restful night, placing in God's hands the work we have left undone, asking him to bless the work we were able to do.

It's a charmingly beautiful and brief prayer service. If you've never experienced it, please consider participating, even for a few nights, if not all of them.

The entire diocesan church is invited to participate. It would be a wonderful expression of our signature hospitality and a testimony to our love for our church if many of our parishioners were able to come to pray and welcome brothers and sisters from throughout the diocese.

This initiative comes directly from the bishop's office and is a part of his plan to welcome people back to church to worship in person.

# **PSR PREPARATIONS**

Parish School of Religion

At a meeting of the PSR staff and teachers this last Tuesday evening, it was decided that we will conduct class sessions once again using the Zoom format and technology. The Delta variant of the coronavirus is that dangerous; and we are recommended (vaccinated or not) to wear masks in indoor, public gatherings until the virus is under control.

The exceptions are that the Pre-K class and K-1 class will be in person in the parish center as we did last year. A decision about the First Communion and Confirmation classes will be forthcoming.

A significant change this year will be that ordinarily we will have class twice every month. One hour a month, or a three-hour marathon in-person session does not provide the continuity necessary for an effective learning environment. Please notice this change. A schedule of classes is available for the asking.

The Women's Guild will meet Saturday, August 14<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 am in the Parish Center. In general the ministry meets the first Saturday of each month. One of their ministries most appreciated by those who are served, is their outreach to homebound parishioners and those in nursing care. There are also plenty of social activities that strengthen friendships and the mission of the church.
