

NATIONAL BLACK CATHOLIC HISTORY MONTH

On July 24, 1990, the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus designated November as Black Catholic History Month, to celebrate the proud heritage of Black Catholics. Throughout the world today there are over two hundred million people of African descent in the Roman Catholic Church. Three million of them live and worship in the United States.

Two commemorative dates fall within this month, Saint Martin de Porres' Feast Day (November 3) and Saint Augustine's Birthday (November 13). Saint Martin de Porres, was the first Black American saint. He was canonized by Pope Saint John XXIII on May 16, 1962. Throughout his life, Saint Martin exemplified God's love for all people, regardless of their standing in society. November is a time when we pray for all our ancestors in loving remembrance; we especially remember our ancestors of Africa and the African Diaspora.

ANNUAL COMMEMORATION OF THE DECEASED

Our parish's annual commemoration of the deceased is Sunday, November 7th at the 10:30 am Mass. Special features of the liturgy and the month-long remembrance include:

- 1. The names of our parish members who have died in the last twelve months will be read during the general intercessions. Family members and friends of the deceased are invited to stand at the announcement of their loved one's name. A burning candle in front of the altar will remain during the Mass; it can be taken home after Mass.
- 2. The names of our dearly departed over the past year will be displayed in the church throughout November.
- 3. "The Book of Life" is the large book that rests on the side altar below the statue of Saint Joseph who is the patron saint of a happy death. Anyone is always free to inscribe the name of a deceased loved one in the book; when we pray for the dead during every Mass, those whose names are written in the book are consciously included in that prayer.
- 4. Resources are available for those who are burdened by grief, which can be especially strong during the holiday and holy day seasons.
