BLACK CATHOLIC HISTORY MONTH



This week in Black Catholic history, we celebrate the birthday of Saint Augustine, who was born on November 13, 354 in Algeria. After his conversion to Christianity, he became Bishop of Hippo, an ancient port on the north coast of Africa. He is the first Black Christian to be honored with the title, Doctor of the Church.



Did you know that Fr. Charles Uncles (1859-1933) ordained in December 1891, a native of Baltimore, was the first African American ordained a Roman Catholic priest in the United States? He was one of the founders of the St. Joseph's Society of the Sacred Heart, formed to minister to the Black community. As such, he

was the first and only African American to establish a society or order of priests.
