

ADVENT REVIVAL Gathering in Hope and Promise



For three evenings during the second week of Advent, Saint Agnes + Our Lady of Fatima Church is hosting an Advent revival. Father Anthony Bozeman, SSJ, a respected and eloquent preacher, is the revivalist.

Pandemic restrictions interrupted plans for the annual Lenten revival earlier this year. In the absence of any planning for a revival this coming Lent, Saint Agnes + Our Lady of Fatima Church has taken the initiative to gather our community in common prayer and praise during the season of preparation to celebrate the coming of our God, as one just like us in every way, but sin.

December 8th, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin, is a holy day of obligation. The Mass which opens the revival that day fulfills our obligation to attend Mass on the feast day.


