TEXAS ABOLISHED SLAVERY

During the time that parts of Texas were governed by Mexico, the Mexican government opposed slavery. However, the Republic of Texas (with approximately 5000 enslaved people in its geographical boundaries), modelled its 1830 Constitution on the Constitution of the United States of America, which protected slavery. It stripped the Republic's Congress of the ability to pass any legislation affecting the slave trade. No slave owner was able to free slaves in the Republic of Texas unless the Texas Republic's Congress consented. Free Blacks, if any, had to get permission from the Congress to continue living there. They were considered a threat to slavery as an institution, encouraging slaves to escape. There was hardly any democratic process available to any black person in 1830's Texas.



On March 17, 1836 Mexican President Vincente Guerrero issued a decree abolishing slavery throughout all of Texas. However, the abolishment of slavery during Guerrero's administration was short-lived as the American settlers found ways around the laws the Mexican government put in place, including lying about the slaves they were bringing into the territory.

These events were factors leading up to the Texas Revolution by settlers and the removal of Mexican control over the area.

HOLY SPIRIT CHURCH MUSIC MINISTRY

For the last two years cantors have anchored our music ministry. It has not been safe for a group of people to gather in a choir, in close proximity, singing boldly and full-throatedly. We have used small scholas of cantors on occasion for the most solemn celebrations.

While so much uncertainty still surrounds us regarding the pandemic and how best to keep ourselves and each other safe as we are faced with variants, we are taxing the availability of the cantors willing to help lead our worship. So, this is a request to our cantors and choir: if you are feeling safe enough in church, will you take a turn being the sole vocal leader to help lead us in our sung prayer?

All you have to do is come to practice and agree to give your best effort while continuing to learn the art of leading a congregation in singing.

The future of our choir begins here.

Last Sunday we concluded our schedule of listening sessions for the synod. Since the end of November we have had 17 sessions and approximately 54 people participated.



HEALTH UPDATE

Father David continues to recuperate. His second surgery – the one to provide a permanent repair to his right leg – is scheduled for tomorrow (Monday). The surgeon says it is a complicated procedure but he is confident in predicting a successful outcome.

The plan is that after a night in the hospital, Father David will be discharged to begin physical therapy -a few days of hard work will give a better sense of when he can return to the church, and the length of time his total recovery will take. He is working to be back among the parish as soon as possible.
