During the listening sessions, participants were asked to identify emerging actions that could be implemented at the local level. We will continue the conversation here and develop a plan to address and implement those recommendations.

At the diocesan level, the synthesis reports will be reviewed and summarized from the listening sessions, online participation survey, and family conversation starters into a working document that will inform conversations during the diocesan presynodal gathering in June. Following the June gathering, a 10page diocesan synthesis report will be compiled and sent to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

As soon as our summary report is completed, we will share it with the parish at large as well as forward it to the diocese.
