THE SACRED PASCHAL TRIDUUM

The holiest and most solemn of all church celebrations are this week, as we celebrate Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter – the Paschal Triduum. The church's celebration of Easter begins with the long vigil that begins after sunset on Saturday night – as we keep watch for the signs that our loving Lord is alive and his tomb is empty.

If you are able, you will not regret coming to church each day (Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday) to celebrate these most precious days on our calendar. Hope to see you here.

The church's long tradition insists that what happened once in history passes over into the mystery of the assembly's liturgical celebrations. The liturgies of these days do not take us back to the upper room or the path of Calvary. Their ultimate purpose is not to retrace or relive the last hours of Jesus' life – nor to catch sight of him emerging from the tomb at Easter's dawning.

They celebrate not what once happened to Jesus but what is now happening among us as a people called to conversion, gathered in faith, and gifted with the Spirit.

IT'S FINALLY GOING TO HAPPEN! VACCINATION CLINIC AT HOLY SPIRIT CHURCH

Months ago, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health has asked our help in providing a location to set up monthly vaccination clinics. Garfield Heights and the 44105 zip code have, among all the zip codes and municipalities in Ohio, the lowest vaccination rate among the eligible population: less that 40%.

On the fourth Thursday of this month (April 28th), staff of the Board of Health will be here to give the vaccination to anyone who comes. We are asked to provide a couple of parish volunteers to offer a warm welcome and help with other duties of hospitality.

Representatives of the Board of Health recently visited to plan the day's logistics. For now, we know this much:

- Even though we start on April 28th, with vaccines available from 2:00 4:00 pm, subsequent days and times are scheduled. As soon as they are confirmed, we will pass the information along;
- All three vaccines are expected to be available for the asking (Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson);
- First doses, second doses, and boosters are all part of the plan.

If you have not been vaccinated and are medically eligible, please accept the vaccine. You are not only protecting yourself, but everyone you contact. It is an act of love.

Please encourage any unvaccinated person you know to take advantage of this opportunity.


