BEYOND THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS

When we promise our prayers, that is a sacred duty which we must fulfill to be people of our word. Turning to God for his grace and guidance in uncertain times is vitally necessary, but it is not all we can do. Especially when the problems we face are of human making, asking God to do all the work of fixing them is an abdication of our own responsibility.

Here are two practical steps we can take to influence policy makers and those whose voices reach much farther than any one of us alone:

- ◆ There is a letter addressed to Bishop Malesic asking him to make a stronger public statement against the sin of racism and the degrading violence it fosters. We are asking him to boldly and unabashedly name racism and pledge the efforts of the Diocese of Cleveland to point it out and root it out. If you agree with the content of Father David's letter, you are invited to sign on to it; copies of the letter are at the church doors. You are always free, of course, to write your own letter.
- ◆ Contact information for our elected officials on the federal level is also at the church doors, along with copies of a letter which will be individually addressed to them demanding meaningful action to limit the availability of assault-style weapons and to close gaping loopholes in current regulations which render them nearly meaningless.

DIOCESAN PRE-SYNODAL GATHERING
and the launch of a
EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL



Every parish has been asked to name five delegates to participate in this gathering which takes place on Saturday this week. Our representatives to the event are:

The objective of the gathering is to bring together a representative cross-section of the whole diocese, and to enable participants to pray, listen, reflect, and discern together. After this gathering, the outcomes will be included as part of the diocesan synthesis, together with the feedback that emerged from the listening sessions across the diocese, which will be sent to the Vatican.

The end of this phase of the synod coincides with the opening of a nationwide eucharistic revival. A 4:30 pm Mass at the cathedral on Saturday closes the synod process in the diocese. Following the Mass there will be a procession with the Eucharist from the cathedral to Saint Peter Church on East 17th Street where food will be served.

Every member of the diocese is invited to the Mass at the cathedral, to participate in the procession to Saint Peter Church, and then to the social taking place there.

The eucharistic revival culminates in a four-day event in Indianapolis in the summer of 2024. The purpose of this entire initiative is the renewal of the church by enkindling a living relationship in the life of every member of the church with the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist.

More information will be announced as the process unfolds.

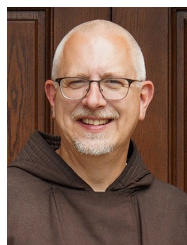
