BEYOND THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS

When we promise our prayers, that is a sacred duty which we must fulfill to be people of our word. Turning to God for his grace and guidance in uncertain times is vitally necessary, but it is not all we can do. Especially when the problems we face are of human making, asking God to do all the work of fixing them is an abdication of our own responsibility.

Here are two practical steps we can take to influence policy makers and those whose voices reach much farther than any one of us alone:

- ◆ There is a letter addressed to Bishop Malesic asking him to make a stronger public statement against the sin of racism and the degrading violence it fosters. We are asking him to boldly and unabashedly name racism and pledge the efforts of the Diocese of Cleveland to point it out and root it out. If you agree with the content of Father David's letter, you are invited to sign on to it; copies of the letter are at the church doors.
- Contact information for our elected officials on the federal level is also at the church doors, along with copies of a letter which will be individually addressed to them demanding meaningful action to limit the availability of assault-style weapons and to close gaping loopholes in current regulations which render them nearly meaningless.

You are welcome to sign on to one or both letters, or writing your own letter in your own words is always an option.


