#### A MESSAGE FOR PSR FAMILIES

Parish School of Religion 2022 - 2023

As we begin in-person class sessions for PSR two Sundays from now, please be aware that we are not returning to the way we did things before the pandemic started. The class is on Sunday now, immediately after the 10:30 Mass. Class lasts only one hour, noon to 1:00 pm. That means that we will be dismissing the children at 1:00; because our PSR staff lacks much flexibility in their own family schedules, please be sure to be ready at the end of that hour to pick up those for whom you are responsible.

We will provide a snack for the children immediately as they enter the building, something to hold them until class is over. One of the two teachers in each classroom will welcome the children at the door, and guide them upstairs to their classrooms where they will find a snack and the other teacher waiting for them.

We will also offer a refreshment for the family members dropping off their children and we promise good conversation. Rather than retreating to your car and waiting there for an hour, please come on in.

- ◆ PSR classes will be for one hour on the first and third Sundays of each month from 12:00 noon 1:00 pm, beginning with Sunday, September 18th.
- The complete schedule of class dates is available on the website, as is a list of the teachers at each grade level.
- A registration form is available on the parish website and paper copies are at the church doors. Please complete one form for each child you are registering.
- Please register your students as soon as possible to help us complete our preparations.
- ♦ You can register students for First Communion and Confirmation classes using the same form used for PSR.

PSR teachers and staff are reminded that there is a staff meeting on Thursday evening the 15th at 7:00 pm by way of Zoom.

#### **CATHOLIC CHARITIES GOAL REACHED FOR 2022**

The diocese recently reported to us that our parish reached, and exceeded, the assessed goal given us to help fund Catholic Charities. #### COULD IT HAPPEN HERE?

The Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department made an extensive presentation on the last Sunday of July that was attended by almost 50 of us about the ways we can maximize our safety in the event that a person intent on violence enters our worship or meeting spaces.

Since then, a small group of parishioners, trained in law enforcement, have begun to organize and create a plan for us, hoping that using it will never be necessary. If anyone would like to be a part of this planning and these conversations, please leave a message for Father David at the parish office.

When it comes to keeping each other safe in church, or any of our buildings, the first and most important thing that everyone needs to be aware of is how you can exit the building most quickly. Notice that there are six exits from the church to the outside. There are the three entrances that we ordinarily use to enter the building. But there are also other ways out all the time.

If we ever need to evacuate the church building quickly, please know that your fastest and safest way out of the building may not be the way you entered.

#### PASTORAL SKILLS WORKSHOP

In your service to our church, do you ever feel like you would benefit from learning some new communication and interpersonal skills? The Lay Ecclesial Ministry Office is offering a workshop designed to address exactly this.
