

BREAK-IN AT SMART ACADEMY

Well, it wasn't exactly a break-in because two intruders effortlessly entered the building by scurrying up a conduit emerging from an electric meter to reach a window that was evidently left open. Our gratitude goes to a neighbor in the Saint Timothy Park Apartments who called the police; officers were here within minutes.

It happened late in the evening of Sunday, September 18th. Nothing of anything significant value was taken and no damage was done to our building. The police investigation is still open and active; a single fingerprint is the only reliable evidence that might point to the identity of one of the intruders.

In the meantime, the school's officials have promised to be much more vigilant about securing the building at the end of each day. For our part, we are being careful again, and even stubborn, about vehicles that are parked on our property without evident authorization to park here. This will have no impact on any parishioner using our lot for Sunday Mass and other parish activities. This entire



campus is here for you. It is a very rare thing that a parishioner needs to leave a vehicle here overnight. But if you do, that's quite alright. Please, though, let the office know your need. We don't want to tow anyone unnecessarily ever again.
