Our parish celebration always includes a special invitation to the family and loved ones of those whom we have honored here with a Christian burial over the last twelve months. It's our way of offering our prayerful support to members of our community who are mourning the death of a loved one.

Family members of our departed brothers and sisters should have received an invitation, but you don't need an invitation to attend. It's a regular parish Mass; everyone is welcome to come and pray in a special way for deceased loved ones of every place, faith, and generation.

May your beloved know God's mercy, light and love, and may you be filled with the peace that only God can give.
