

TOWN HALL MEETING REPORT



About 75 people remained in church after Mass last Sunday. We reviewed our financial statements and some of the work we've done over the last several years to take care of our buildings and properties.

Overall parishioners are very interested in seeing improvements in our building, particularly to Mulligan Hall. The discussion of accessibility took an

interesting turn with a suggestion that there might be a way to accomplish our goal with an interior ramp rather than an elevator. At this early point in our planning, no idea is beyond consideration.

There are, of course, concerns about current inflation and how it impacts our own household budgets as well as the budget of the parish. Relying on our own resources is unlikely to raise the amount of money (\$300,000.00 is a very rough and low estimate) to address the needed improvements to Mulligan Hall. We just don't have enough deep pockets to make such a commitment in the current economic times.

We will be exploring the availability of grant money and ways to generate the funds needed to bring this dream to fruition. We seem to agree on the goals of this project and that they deserve our attention and energy. We just have to find the best way to accomplish them.

Not everyone had an opportunity to speak last Sunday. If you have thoughts, concerns or questions, we have created a form available on our website for your convenience. We'll keep a close eye on it and take your comments to heart as planning unfolds.

ON HELPING A REFUGEE FAMILY

Shortly after the Thanksgiving holiday, a small group of us met with representatives of Catholic Charities to finally move this initiative forward. After considering several ways our parish might respond to a growing refugee crisis, we believe that the best option for us is to sponsor a family that has resettled in Cleveland.

The responsibilities include checking in on a family at least once a week and then following up on the support they need to make the adjustment to life in the United States. The support consists of tender care for a family that has escaped frightful conditions to search for a place of safety. It might be an afternoon's help to go to a grocery store, to help them purchase bus tickets, to help them enroll children in school, obtain a driver's license, and the like.

To make this work we believe we need a minimum of ten people to be willing to help – perhaps teams of two for a week at a time. The whole commitment is expected to last for three months for one family. Then we can evaluate the experience and decide if we can do it again for another family.
