

As of February 13<sup>th</sup> of last year he is Father Keon. On that day he was ordained to the priesthood in China. You may remember Brother Keon from the summer of 2019. He spent several weeks among us while he was still a theology student.


He has been living and working with other Capuchin friars in China and is back in the States for a while to study canon law at the request of the bishop of the Diocese of Zhouzhi – an expertise much needed to serve the church.

Brother Keon intended to join us for our Christmas Masses last weekend, but the storm forced his plans to change. He stopped by for a few hours this week and left some Christmas cards and a commemorative card of his ordination. Help yourself to them for as long as the supply lasts. And please take a moment to utter a small prayer for Brother Keon and his service to God's church.

## MASS INTENTIONS

It is a centuries and centuries old devotional practice in the Catholic Church to ask a priest to celebrate Mass with a person's prayer intentions in mind. A donation is customary which, in our case, goes to support the friars living at Saint Paul Friary on Euclid Avenue. The recommended donation (set by the diocese, and customary throughout the United States) is \$10, but a priest is obligated to accept whatever is offered because the church's sacraments and God's grace are not for sale.

Church law requires that a priest honor his obligation to celebrate Mass for your intentions within one year of receiving them. Your requests for Mass remembrances are being carefully and prayerfully fulfilled when Father David celebrates Mass every day.

# **BLESSING YOUR HOUSE**

Traditionally on the Feast of the Epiphany, Christians have blessed their homes using a practice sometimes known as "chalking the doors." The following inscription is marked above a doorway in chalk:

# 20 + C + M + B + 23

The letters C, M, B are the initials of the traditional names of the three kings: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. The "+" symbolizes the cross and the 20 and the 23 represent the year, 2023 *(please excuse a three-year-old photograph)*. Mark not only your outside door that welcomes guests to your house, but mark as many doors in your house as seems appropriate to you: bedroom doors, the threshold to living room and kitchen, and so on.

Say this prayer as you mark each door:

May Christ Jesus dwell with us, may he keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever. Amen.



If you're not inclined to mark your best woodwork with chalk, you can still make this a prayerful experience for your family, marking the doorways with your finger (maybe with a little holy water from church) and a heartfelt prayer. It's a beautiful custom.
