

MASS WITH THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK



This Wednesday evening's Mass will include the opportunity for those in attendance to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of The sacrament takes the Sick. place after the homily and before the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

The sacrament is not only for those who are in danger of immi-

nent death and should not be thought of in that way. The sacrament may and should be given to anyone whose health is seriously impaired.

Celebrating the sacrament during Mass gives us the opportunity to collectively bring our weakness and ill health to God for blessing and healing. By the sacrament, we present ourselves and our loved ones to God, and we are strengthened by praying together for each other.

If you know someone among us who has not been able to come to church because of age or illness, maybe you can offer to bring that person to church on Wednesday evening, join your prayers to theirs and take them back home after Mass. You would be fulfilling one of Jesus' most urgent pleas: I was ... ill and you cared for me (cf, Matthew 25: 35 - 36).

When you come that evening, please follow the direction of our ushers. We are deliberately leaving every other pew vacant so that Father David can make his way through the pews, row by row, for the laying on of hands and the anointing. That way, those who have difficulty walking will not have to take unnecessary steps. The Eucharist will be distributed in the same way.

For this momentary light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison.

COMMUNION FROM THE CHALICE The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper



Beginning on Holy Thursday, the day we celebrate the great gift of the Eucharist to the church and the world, we'll begin offering the Eucharist under both forms in the Communion procession. That is, the possibility of receiving the Blood of Christ from the communion cup will be restored. If you are still reluctant about receiving Communion in that form,

please remember that you are not required to.

When Jesus left us the memorial of his life-giving sacrifice and commanded us to do what he did in his memory, he said, "Take this all of you and eat of it, for this is my body" and he went on, "Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my blood."

Because we human beings touch divine realities through earthly and material signs, we do well to engage with the tangible symbols of the divine presence as liberally and as fully as possible. In faith we know that we receive the risen Christ completely when we receive Communion under only the form of bread or wine, however our human instincts know that receiving Communion "has a fuller sign when it takes place under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident" (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, #281).

This weekend's bulletin insert is a more complete description of the reason why every Catholic person has a right to receive the Body and Blood of Christ in the form of bread and in the form of wine.
