

THE SACRED PASCHAL TRIDUUM

Holy Thursday Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper Good Friday of the Passion of the Lord The Easter Vigil of the Lord's Resurrection

The Latin word, *Triduum*, means three days. These are the central celebrations of our faith in Jesus as our Christ, our Messiah, our Savior. The truth is that they are not three separate liturgies; they constitute one liturgy that spans three days.

If you come, you will notice that Mass on Holy Thursday evening begins in the usual way, but it has no discernable ending; we just get up and leave when we're done. The liturgy on Good Friday begins in silence with a humble posture and ends in stark quiet. The Easter Vigil begins not with the usual sign of the cross, but with a wordless lighting of a fire, and then the blessing of light the fire provides. It's all one, unified liturgical prayer that takes us three days to complete.

The church's long tradition insists that what happened once in history passes over into the mystery of our liturgical celebrations. The liturgies of these days do not take us back to the upper room or the path of Calvary. Their ultimate purpose is not to retrace or relive the last hours of Jesus' life – nor to catch sight of him emerging from the tomb at Easter's dawning.

They celebrate not what once happened to Jesus but what is now happening among us as a people called to conversion, gathered in faith, and gifted with the Spirit of holiness. They celebrate God's taking possession of our hearts at their deepest core, recreating us as a new human community broken like bread for the world's life - a community rich in compassion, steadfast in hope, and fearless in the search for justice and peace.

PARENT EDUCATIONAL FREEDOM ACT

Senate Bill 11, called the "Parent Educational Freedom Act," expands eligibility for educational choice scholarships to all students beginning with the 2023-2024 school year. It would provide to parents for each pupil up to \$5500 for grades K - 8, and \$7500 for grades 9 - 12. It also increases the amount of homeschooling expenses that a taxpayer can claim as an income tax credit each year, from \$250 to \$2000.
