

THE AFRICAN PRESENCE IN SCRIPTURE

A THREE-NIGHT SCRIPTURE STUDY Sponsored by the Office of Black Catholic Ministries

Fr. Charles Smith will present a seminar entitled, "African Presence in Scripture" at the Jesuit Retreat Center in Parma. The dates are April 26 - 28 from 6:30 - 8:00 pm. The seminar is designed to be an opportunity to learn to read scripture with enlightened eyes. There is no charge; refreshments will be provided.

The instructor, Fr. Charles Smith, a member of the Society of the Divine Word, has been Co-director of the Bowman Francis Ministry of Indianapolis for more than twenty years. The ministry provides religious education and evangelization projects to the African American Catholic community and non-practicing Catholics.

This seminar provides a comprehensive overview, awareness, and understanding of the biblical historical perspectives that authenticate African presence in Scripture.

WILL YOU STAND WITH ME?

This is my request to our community as we gather to celebrate the Eucharist together. The Easter posture is to stand. Please stand with me.

Ordinarily, kneeling remains the preferred posture during the eucharistic prayer in the United States. But kneeling is not easy or possible for everyone. Standing during the eucharistic prayer is better than sitting. We stand when someone enters a room to greet them. We stand to show respect to another.

Throughout the Easter season, I call upon us to remain standing through the entirety of the eucharistic prayer as we are able. A single posture can speak eloquently to a unity of faith.

Please stand with me through the entirety of the Easter season. When we get to Pentecost, let me know how you experienced it. I'm quite thrilled to be able to stand at the altar this year; please stand with me. fr. David
