The 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit

- 1. WISDOM:** helps us see the world differently and from God's point of view.
- 2. UNDERSTANDING:** enables us to know more clearly the mysteries of faith.
- 3. COUNSEL** [also known as Right Judgment]: helps us to discern what is right and what is wrong.
- 4. FORTITUDE** [also known as Courage]: strengthens our will so that we can actually accomplish what is true, good and beautiful.
- 5. KNOWLEDGE:** enables us to discover God's will in all things.
- 6. PIETY:** helps us to love God, our merciful Father, and to obey his precepts out of love for him.
- 7. FEAR OF THE LORD** [also known as Wonder and Awe]: helps us to understand how we must depend on God for everything. In other words, he is God, we are not.

**WEDNESDAY HOLY HOUR**

This Wednesday, June 31st on the *Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary* we will begin having a regular Holy Hour from 5-6:15pm before the 6:30pm Mass. The Sacrament of Confession will still be available from 5-6pm. Jesus in the blessed sacrament will be exposed for a time of prayer and adoration. *Eucharistic Adoration* allows us to sit and pray in the presence of our Lord. Adoration specifically refers to any prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament whether in front of a closed Tabernacle or in front of the exposed host in a monstrance. Exposition refers specifically to prayer in front of the exposed host in a monstrance. You may hear these terms used interchangeably. During Eucharistic Adoration, it is appropriate to do any of the following...

- Read and reflect on readings from the Bible or other spiritual writings
- Pray the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet or any other favorite devotions
- Converse with God through spontaneous prayer or journaling
- Sit quietly and listen or just enjoy being in the presence of Christ
