Sisters and Brothers of Holy Spirit,

This weekend I would like to share some insights from Liturgical Press regarding the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity:

The essential component of being in relationship with our Trinitarian God is to allow that relationship to impact all that we say and do. To be disciples of the Lord is to live according to Jesus' values and lifestyle and to model for others what relationship with God entails. Our mission is to do for others what Jesus has done for us, in both his words and his deeds, most especially in his loving outreach to all. Blessed are we for having been chosen to be apostolic witnesses to all.

The Gospel highlights God's activity in salvation history. God the Father is described as giving the greatest gift of love to the world - His only Son - and the Son is described as doing the work of the Father. The Spirit is not mentioned here, but later in John's Gospel account we learn that the Spirit is the Advocate sent to be with the believers after Jesus' return to the Father.

In our life with God, we are always entering deeper and deeper into Him with whom we live and move and have our being. Can we trust that God, as a Trinitarian relationship of love, is doing all in His power to draw us into this Divine activity? Can we open our lives to Him in prayer, worship, sacrament, and community? If the answer is yes, then let's live the values and lifestyle that Jesus lived through our loving outreach to all!

Exposition refers specifically to prayer in front of the exposed host in a monstrance. You may hear these terms used interchangeably. During Eucharistic Adoration, it is appropriate

to do any of the following...

- Read and reflect on readings from the Bible or other spiritual writings
- Pray the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet or any other favorite devotions
- Converse with God through spontaneous prayer or journaling
- Sit quietly and listen or just enjoy being in the presence of Christ
