WEDNESDAY HOLY HOUR

We have begun having a regular Holy Hour from 5-6:15pm before the 6:30pm Mass. The Sacrament of Confession will still be available from 5-6pm. Jesus in the blessed sacrament will be exposed for a time of prayer and adoration. *Eucharistic Adoration* allows us to sit and pray in the presence of our Lord. Adoration specifically refers to any prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament whether in front of a closed Tabernacle or in front of the exposed host in a monstrance. Exposition refers specifically to prayer in front of the exposed host in a monstrance. You may hear these terms used interchangeably. During Eucharistic Adoration, it is appropriate to do any of the following...

- Read and reflect on readings from the Bible or other spiritual writings
- Pray the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet or any other favorite devotions
- Converse with God through spontaneous prayer or journaling
- Sit quietly and listen or just enjoy being in the presence of Christ
